Mary Bozman came here into Court in her proper person and prays that her negro man named Jambo may be Tax free for the future he being ancient and Infirm and past Labour &c. Wherefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Mary Bozman be discharged from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid negro Jambo and that the same Negro Jambo be Tax free for the future as aforesaid is said
