Mary Bozman came here into Court in her proper person and prayeth that her negro man named Sambo may be Tax free for the future he being ancient and Infirm and past Labour etc Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that the said Mary Bozman be discharged from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid negro Sambo and that the same Negro Sambo be Tax free for the future as aforesaid is praid for
