Mary Mears } the Lord Proprietor of the province of Maryland held at Dividing Creek in Somer-
set County the third Tuesday of November to witt the Seventeenth day of the same month
Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty One before his said Lordships Justices the peace in
the County aforesaid to keep assynd by the oath of twelve Jurors presented that Mary Mears late of Stepney
parish in the County of Somerset Spinster the thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and forty at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of this Court
did Commit Fornication with a certain person to the Jurors aforesaid known and did permit the same unknown
person then and there to have carnal knowledge of her body and then and there to beget a bastard child on the
body of her the same Mary Mears to the high displeasure of Almighty God to the evill Example of
all others in such case offending Contrary to the peace of the said Lord Proprietor that now is his good rule and
Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided —

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of the County of Somerset that he should take the said
Mary Mears if she should be found in his baileywick and her should safe keep so that he might have her body
before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of
March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to answer unto his said Lordship of the Indictment aforesaid

Who now to witt at a Court held for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of March being the Sixteenth day of the
same month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one before his said Lordships Justices at Dividing
Creek came the sd Mary Mears in her proper person and had a hearing of the Indictment aforesaid and saith that she
cannot deny but that she is guilty of the premises aforesaid in the Indictment aforesaid Specified in manner and form as by
the Indictment aforesaid above against her supposed and the premises in the Indictment aforesaid especially acknowledged
and
