The Same } Somerset } Memorandum that at a Court of his Lordship the right Hon^{ble} the Lord
John Riggie } propriety of the province of Maryland held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November to wit

the seventeenth day of the same month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one
before his said Lordships Justices the peace in the County of. to keep assigned by the oath of twelve Jurors premised
that John Riggie son of George Riggie late of Coventry Parish in the said County of Somerset planter the seventh
day of October in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and forty one with force and arms &c at
the parish of. in the County of. within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon a certain Charles Dickerson in the
peace of God and the said Lord propriety that now is then and there being in highway an assault did make and him
the said Charles then and there did beat wound and evilly treat so that of his life it was greatly disparaged and other
harm to the ^{same} Charles then and there did to the grievous damage of him the said Charles and contrary to the peace of the
Right honorable the Lord propriety that now is his good rule and Government.

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said John Riggie
if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his
Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next following to
answer unto his said Lordship of the Indictment of.

And now to wit the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one at a Court then
held at dividing Creek before his Lordships Justices came the said John Riggie in his proper person and had a hearing of
the Indictment of. and saith that he will not plead with his said Lordship but submits with a protestation of his Innocency
and puts himself upon the favour of the Court

Whereupon all and singular the premises being seen and by the Court here fully understood It is Consi-
dered by the Court here that the said John Riggie pay unto his said Lordship the right Hon^{ble} the Lord propriety of the
province of Maryland for his fine by the Court here upon him Imposed for and by occasion of the premises of. whereof
in form of. he is convicted two shillings and sixpence Curr^t money of Maryland and that the said John Riggie be taken to
satisfie his said Lordship of the fine of. thereupon the said John Riggie is discharged paying the Court
officer their fees &c
