

Commanded and further the said sheriff returned that he had served the said Weber with a copy of the foregoing Declaration according to Act of Assembly in such case made and provided &c

And the said Weber Whittingham at the prayer of the said William Elligood is adjudged to give special bail to the action aforesaid Thereupon a certain John Torrey of Somerset County planter present herein but in his proper person undertook for the said Weber Whittingham (Likewise the said Weber Whittingham present herein Court in his proper person assumed upon himself) that if it should happen that Judgment in the plea aforesaid should be rendered for the name William Elligood against the same Weber Whittingham or that he the same Weber Whittingham should be therein Convict that then he the said Weber Whittingham should pay and satisfy unto the said William Elligood the Judgment of the Court thereupon or render his body in Execution of such Judgment to the prison of the sheriff of the County aforesaid in satisfaction thereof or that he the said John Torrey will do the same for him &c

And the said Weber Whittingham in his proper person comes and defends the force and Injury when he saith, that he cannot deny the Petition aforesaid of the said William Elligood nor say he say but that he owes the said William Elligood ^{thirty} eight pounds Curr^t money of Maryland and four hundred and fourteen pounds of tobacco in manner and form as the said William above against him hath declared - Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said William Elligood recover against the said Weber Whittingham his debt aforesaid and his damages by occasion of the detention of the same debt to: pounds of tobacco with stay of

Somerset Benjamin Warrington late of Somerset County Carpenter was attached to answer unto William Lockwood of a plea of trespass upon the case &c And whereupon the same William by Robert Jenkins Henry his Attorney complains that whereas the said Benjamin after the first day of May in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and five to wit the first day of May in the year
