Connelly in these words following vizt Be it Remembred that Robert Jenkins Henry Gent  
attorney of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is in whose for the same Lord Proprietary in  
this part prosecuteth doth come hereinto the Court of the same Lord Proprietary held for Somerset County  
as followeth dividing first in the same County the nineteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and forty before Robert King Esq: and his associates the said Lord Proprietary his Justices of  
the same County Court and for the same Lord Proprietary doth give the Court here to understand and be  
informed that whereas a certain Ann Clark late of Stepney parish in the said County of Somerset the ninth  
day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty did wilfully force and arm at the parish  
of in the County of one pound four shillings in gold currency of the province of Maryland and twelve  
shillings and six pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of the province of in bills of credit of the goods and chattles of  
a certain Hugh Rimmer then and feloniously did shall take and bear away contrary to the peace of the said  
Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and government and the same attorney of the said Lord Proprietary  
for the same Lord Proprietary doth give the Court here further to understand and be informed that Patrick  
Connelly late of Somerset parish in the said County of Somerset fel m<sup>ur</sup> after the tenth day of February  
one thousand seven hundred and two and after the felony aforesaid informed doth have done and perpetrated  
knowing thereto Ann Clark the felony aforesaid to have done and perpetrated and also knowing the  
one pound and four shillings in gold currency of the province of Maryland and twelve shillings and six  
pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of the province of in bills of credit to have been so aforesaid stolen on the tenth day of June  
in the year of at stepney parish of in the said County of Somerset the said Patrick Connelly the several  
sums of one pound and four shillings in gold currency of and twelve shillings and six pence curr<sup>t</sup> money of  
the province of in bills of credit knowing the same to be stolen in manner and form aforesaid from the said Ann  
Clark feloniously did receive to the evil and pernicious example of all others in such case offending  
contrary to the peace of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and government  
and against the form of the statute in such case lately made and provided & whether with the said Attorney of  
the same Lord Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary pray the advice of the Court herein the premises  
and that due process of Law in this part against the same Patrick Connelly may be made to answer unto the  
same Lord Proprietary and upon the premises &c And the said information was drawn upon  
written being to the said Justices then and there did maliciously cause to be presented and read by means whereof  
the said Patrick afterwards toward the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid was arrested and by the Sheriff of  
Somerset County in prison detained until he the said Patrick recognised before the said Justices in the sum of  
fifty
