the aforesaid Edmund here also doe All which day here come again as well the aforesaid Edmund -

Though as the aforesaid Thomas Dingally by their attorney aforesaid and the said Thomas Relinquished his Benefaction aforesaid by him above pretended and saith that he cannot deny the action aforesaid of the aforesaid Edmund though now in he say but that the writing obligatory is the deed of him the same Thomas Dingally nor but that he owes the same Edmund the aforesaid twenty one pounds per cent money of Maryland in manner and form as the aforesaid Edmund above against him hath declared doe

Therefore it is Considered that the aforesaid Edmundough recover against the aforesaid Thomas Dingally his Debt aforesaid and his Damages by Occasion of the detention of the same Debt to: Two hundred and Sixty nine pounds aforesaid ⁶⁵⁷ - doe pounds of tobacco to the same Edmund of his Agent by the Court here adjudged and the aforesaid Thomas in mercy ^{for} memorandum the plaintiff Relinquit all the debt above save Two pounds and five Shillings per cent money and doe

On command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Peter Taylor late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third Tuesday of August anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty one to answer unto James Anderson of a plea of trespass upon the said doe and the same day is given to the aforesaid James Anderson

All which day here come the aforesaid James Anderson by Robert Jenkins Henry his attorney and the Sheriff of Somerset County to wit John Hoadly Gentleman at the same day returned that he had taken the aforesaid Peter Taylor whose body as he had here ready to answer the aforesaid James Anderson of the aforesaid place as to him it was commanded - And whereupon the said Peter Taylor put in his place George Douglas Gentleman attorney at Law against the aforesaid James Anderson of the aforesaid place Whereupon at the request of the parties aforesaid day is
