Ordered that John Pollard and John Shilly recover against Robert Edge ninety pounds of tobacco each being due unto them for their attendance three days each as evidences on behalf of the said Robert Edge against William Friggs they having made oath to the same *ye*

Ordered that Angelo Atkinson recover against Whittington King one hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco - being due unto him for his attendance five days ^{as evidence} on behalf of the said Whittington King against Finch Jones he having made oath to the same *ye*

Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Arthur War-
wick if he should be found in his baileywick and him should safe keep so that he might have
his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing
gresh the third Tuesday of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty one to satisfy William
Pilchard of one hundred and eighty six pounds of tobacco which to the same William in his Lordships County
Court of Somerset before the Justices thereof of dividing gresh by discretion of the same our Justices were adjuged
for his costs and charges which he sustained in a certain plea of trespass upon the case by the *esq* Arthur Warwick
against the same William Pilchard in the same Court Impetrated according to the form of the statute thereof made and
provided against parties plaintiffs which their writs in such manner of plead do not prosecute or in the same should be
precluded whereof he is convicted and the same day is given to the *esq* William Pilchard

All which day here came the *esq* William Pilchard in his proper person and the sheriff (to wit) John
Standly gent. at the same day nowhere returned that he had taken the *esq* Arthur Warwick whose body here at this day
he had ready to satisfy the said William of the costs *esq* as to him it was commanded *ye*

for Comfort Penchinson
Command was given to the sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Heber
Heber Whittingham Whittingham late of Somerset County gentleman if he should be found in his baileywick and him
should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County
Court of Somerset to be held at dividing gresh the third Tuesday of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred
and forty one to satisfy Comfort Penchinson of thirteen pounds ten shillings and seven pence *lxxvii* money and
twelve hundred and eighteen pounds of tobacco which to the same Comfort Penchinson in the same Court before
his Lordships Justices at dividing gresh were adjuged for his Damages which he had by Occasion of a certain
promise.
