All which day here came the said Day Scott by Robert Jenckins Henry his Attorney and the sheriffe to witt John Handley Gent. now here made return of the foregoing writt to the Court here endorsed in these words following

I comert s/ I do hereby humbly certifie unto the Justices within mentioned that by Virtue of the within Writt to me directed on the twenty seventh day of may in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty two I attached within my Bailiwick of the Goods and Chattles of the within named William King to the Value of two pounds six shillings and five pence Curr<sup>t</sup> money and seven hundred and one pound of tobacco as by a Schedule thereof hereunto annexed may appear which I have heretofore to be condemned according to Act of Assembly to satisfy the within named Day Scott the said sum of two pounds six shillings and five pence and two hundred and twenty six pounds of tobacco which to the same Day Scott &c. were adjudged for his Damages &c. agreeable to the within writt and as I am hereby Committed
