his Costs and Charges ass<sup>ts</sup> to him to be adjudged &

Therefore it is considered that the aforesaid Jacob Hindman Recover against the aforesaid  
William Willoughby James his damages aforesaid to the aforesaid five shillings and five pence Curr<sup>nt</sup> money  
of Maryland and four hundred and thirty two pounds of tobacco by the same William Willoughby James  
in form aforesaid acknowledged as also two hundred and Sixty Six pounds of tobacco for his Costs and Charges  
aforesaid to the same Jacob at his request by the Court now here adjudged and the aforesaid William in Money  
and afterwards to wit the fifteenth day of June and D<sup>ts</sup> One thousand Seven hundred and forty Two  
the said William Willoughby James present herein Court in his proper person and whereupon the same William  
Willoughby James at the prayer of the aforesaid Jacob Hindman is committed into the Custody or prison of the  
Sheriff of the County aforesaid there to remain until the said Jacob of his damages Costs and Charges aforesaid should  
be there of fully satisfied whereupon the said Sheriff to wit John Handy Gent present herein Court took Charge of  
the said William Willoughby James accordingly &c

the third Tuesday of June and D<sup>ts</sup> One thousand Seven hundred and forty Two to satisfy Benjamin  
Warrington of eight pounds Curr<sup>nt</sup> money of Maryland and three hundred and eighty seven pounds of tobacco  
which to the same Benjamin in his Lordships County Court of Somerset before the Justices thereof at dividing  
Creek were adjudged for his damages which he had by Occasion of a certain promise and assumption to the  
same Benjamin by the aforesaid James made and not performed whereof he is Comid &c
