Term the said apprenticeship in said Master well and faithfully he shall serve, his secret keep, his commandments lawfully, and honestly every willingly he shall doe, and in all things as a good and faithfull apprentice shall demean himself towards his said Master and all him during the term aforesaid &c.

In consideration of which service the said Samuel Hudson present herein Court in his proper person
covenanteth with the Justices of the same Court, in Court judicially sitting, in manner and form following, that is to say that
he the said Samuel Hudson during the term aforesaid shall and will teach his said apprentice the Trade of a light Cooper,
giving him One whole years Schooling, and at the Expiration of his servitude give him a new Suit of Cloaths over and above his
common wearing Cloaths, and a set of Coopers Tools, and Likewise provide for his said apprentice, meat, drink, washing,
Lodging, and Cloathing, sufficient for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said Samuel Hudson is ordered by the Court here to give security for to comply with the fore-
said covenants &c. - Thereupon the said Samuel Hudson together with Alexander Linn and Thomas Loftin of Somerset County -
plantes his security all present herein Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto the said John
Napman in twenty pounds current money of Maryland of their body, goods, or chattels Lands or tenements severally to be
made and Levied to the use of the said John Napman his heirs and assigns, If it happen that the said Samuel Hudson do not
during the term aforesaid teach his said apprentice the Trade of a light Cooper and do not give him One whole years Schooling
and at the Expiration of his servitude do not give him a new suit of Cloaths over and above his common wearing Cloaths and a set
of Coopers Tools, and do not provide for his said apprentice, meat, drink, washing, Lodging, and Cloathing, sufficient for such
an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesaid &c.

William Smith Cooper until he arrives at the age of Twenty One Years he being sixteen Years of age the tenth day of

where willingly he shall doe, and in all things as a good and faithfull apprentice shall demean himself towards his said

In consideration of which service the said William Smith present herein Court in his proper person -
covenanteth with the Justices of the same Court in Court judicially sitting in manner and form following that is to say
that he the said William Smith during the term aforesaid shall and will teach his said apprentice the trade of a light Cooper
and give him One whole years Schooling and at the Expiration of his servitude give him a new Suit of Cloaths over and
above his common wearing Cloaths, and Likewise provide for his said apprentice meat, drink, washing, Lodging and Cloath-
ing sufficient for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term aforesaid &c.

Whereupon the said William Smith is ordered to give security for to comply with the covenants aforesaid -
thereupon the said William Smith together with Michael Holland Jr. of Somerset County plantes his security both present here-
