William Knowles month anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty at a court then held at dividing Creek before his Lordships Justices came a certain William Knowles in his proper person according to a certain Recognition by him and his security in this part first acknowledged and prays that his appearance may be recorded and he and his security from the Recognition aforesaid may be discharged. Thereupon the said William Knowles appearance is recorded and he and his security of and from the Recognition aforesaid are discharged.

Whereupon the said William Knowles is directed give security for all fee or fees due on the recognition aforesaid.

Thereupon a certain George Dashiell of Somerset County gent present here in Court in his proper person undertook for the said William Knowles to pay all fee or fees due on the recognition to any person or persons whatsoever in the said William Knowles doe not pay the same.

Whereas complaint hath this day been made to me the subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the County aforesaid by David Brown that the above William Willcox is indebted to him the sum of twelve pounds Court money and that the said William Willcox has absconded from Justice and has removed and is about to removeth his effects with a design to defraud his creditors of all which he has made due proof agreeable to an Act of Assembly for that purpose made.

There are therefore in his Lordships name to require you on sight hereof to issue an attachment against the effects of the above named William Willcox in whose hands soever that they may be to satisfy the above sum of twelve pounds Court money aforesaid with such costs as shall legally answer on the same and for so doing this shall be your power given under my hand and seal this 20th day of August 1740 To M^r Thomas Hayward C^o Somerset County
