of Twelue pounds curr. mony of maryland and six hundred pounds of tobacco and when you haue the same attacted or aliy part thereof the same in your custody safe keepe so that you haue the same before our Justices of our County Court of Quarter to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of November next then and there to be condemned according to Act of Assembly to and for the use of a certain David Brown Unles the said William Wilcox by himself or his attorney shall appear and Answer unto the said David Brown of a plea of the p[ro]p[ri]et[y] upon this case &c. According to law and that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailewiche you make known unto his person or persons in whose hands you make this same attachment that he she or they be and appear before our Justices of our County Court to be held aforesaid to shew cause if any he she or they have why the same Chattels Rights or Credits so attacted in his her or their hands ought not to be condemned and Execution thereof had and made according to Act of Assembly in such case made and provided into him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall execute this writt that you make known unto our said Justices at the day and place aforesaid and haue you then and thens this writt witness Robert Olding Gent: Chief Justice of our County Court this Twentieth day of August Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty.

All which day here came the aforesaid David Brown by Robert Denchins Henry his attorney and the Sheriff to wit John Handys Gent: now here returned the aforesaid Writ therewith enclosed in these words following.

Somerset: I do hereby humbly Certify to this Justice within mentioned that by vertus of the within writt borne directed on the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty within my Bailewiche I have attacted of the goods and Chattels Rights and Credits of the within named William Wilcox to the Value of Twelue pounds curr. mony of maryland and six hundred pounds of tobacco in the hands Daniel Jones, Thomas Lovington, and Thomas Durnum severally to be condemned according to law to and for the use of David Brown in the within writt named, and I do hereby further Certify that by George Crivin and John Doe good and Lawfull men of my Bailewiche I have made known to the said Daniel Jones, Thomas Lovington and Thomas Durnum that they severally be and appear before this Justice within contained at the time and place within specified to shew cause why as by that writt I am commanded. So Answers John Handys shd

Whereupon the aforesaid Daniel Jones, Thomas Lovington, and Thomas Durnum Garnishers of the aforesaid William Wilcox in their own proper persons appear and the said Daniel Jones saith that he cannot deny but that he hath of the goods and Chattels of the said William Wilcox to one Quire spinning wheel and one pine Chest, and the said Thomas Lovington saith that he cannot gainsay but that he hath in his hands of the Rights and Credits of the said William Wilcox to no severall pounds curr. mony of Maryland and not more and the said Thomas Durnum garnisher as aforesaid saith that he cannot gainsay but that he hath in his hands of the goods and Chattels of the said William Wilcox in his hands to thirty sheaves of Broad flax and not more. and the said Daniel Jones, Thomas Lovington and Thomas Durnum all severally say that they cannot deny but that the said spinning wheel and Chest, and severall pounds curr. mony of Maryland, and thirty Sheaves of Broad flax.
