The Same Now to witt the seventeenth day of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty a -  
Stephen Lanck Court then held at dividing Creek and for the County aforesaid before his Lordships Justices came a -  
certain Stephen Lanck in his proper person According to a certain Recognition by him in this part before -  
acknowledged and prayes that his appearance may be recorded and he discharged

Thereupon the said Stephen Lanck his appearance is recorded and he accordingly discharged

Whereupon the said Stephen Lanck is ordered to Enter into new Recognition in Twenty pounds Current Money  
for his the said Stephen Lanck's appearance before his Lordship Justices at the next Court to be held at Dividing Creek  
the third Tuesday of June next following to give Evidence on behalfe of his Lordship against Francis Tate on suspicion  
offelony &c

Thereupon the said Stephen Lanck present herein Court in his proper person acknowledg'd himself Indebted unto his Lordship in the sum of Twenty pounds curr. money of Maryland of his body  
goods, or Chattells, Lands or tenements, to be made and Levied to the Use of his said Lordship his heirs and  
Successors If it happen that the said Stephen Lanck doth not make his personale appearance before the  
Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid

the third Tuesday of June next following, and doe not then and there give such Evidence as he shall know  
against the aforesaid Francis Tate on suspicion of felony and do depart the same Court without Leave &c.

The same Somerset f<sup>t</sup> Memorandum that at a Session of the peace of his Lordship the right Honourable the  
Jean Harman Lord Proprietor of the province of Maryland held at dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday  
of November to witt the eighteenth day of the same month anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty before his  
said Lordships Justices the peace in the County aforesaid to keep assynd by the Oath of twelve Jurors being presented that  
Jean Harman late of Althallowes parish in the County aforesaid spinster the twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one  
thousand seven hundred and forty nine at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid and within the jurisdiction  
of this Court did Comit fornication with a certain person to the Jurors aforesaid unknown and did permitt the same unknown  
person then and there to have carnall Knowledge of her body and then and there to beget a bastard on the Body of her  
the same Jean to the high displeasure of Almighty God to the Guill Example of all others in such case offending Contrary  
to the peace of the said Lord Proprietor that now is his good Rule and Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly  
in such case lately made and provided

Thereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said  
Jean Harman if she should be found in his Bailiwick and her should safe keep so that he might her Body before the Justices of his Lordships County  
Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek in and for the County aforesaid the third Tuesday of March anno Domini one thousand  
seven
