six shillings halfe penny to be paid unto the said Martha, Joseph, Perkins, and Dorothy Venables their heir Exe<sup>c</sup> Adm<sup>t</sup> or  
assignes to the which payment well and truly to be made and done we bind our selves our and either of our heirs Exe<sup>c</sup> Adm<sup>t</sup> or  
for the whole and in the whole Jointly and Severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
March anno Dom<sup>m</sup> 1740

The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the Commissary gent<sup>r</sup> hath transmitted unto this Court  
the account of the estate of William Venables dece<sup>d</sup> wherein it is found that there is balance due to the above said Orphans the  
sum of twenty nine pounds and three shillings one farthing therefore if the above said Katherine Venables William Venables  
and George Hardy they or any of their heirs Exe<sup>c</sup> Adm<sup>t</sup> shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the above said  
Orphans the aforesaid sum of twenty nine pounds and three shillings one farthing in Equal parts and portions according to Act of  
Assembly when they shall arrive at full age to receive the same & then the above obligation to be void and of none Effect  
otherwise to remain in full force and vertue in Law.

unknown person then and there to have carnall knowledge of her body and then and there to beget a Bastard child on  
the body of her the same Sarah to the high displeasure of Almighty God to the Evill Example of all others in such  
case
