Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty with force and arms at the parish of Stepney aforesaid in the County of the dwelling house of a certain Elodgate Hitch about the Eleventh hour in the night time of the same day — Feloniously and burglariously did break and enter with intent to steal the goods and chattels of the same Elodgate in the same house then being a certain Rachell Price with others of the family of the said Elodgate in the said house then and there being in the peace of God and the same Lord property and her the said Rachell and others of the said Family in such fear then and there Feloniously and burglariously did put that of their Lives it was greatly dispairee contrary to the peace of the Right Honourable the Lord proprietary that now is his good rule and government &c.

Testes Isaac Hande Rachell Price and Negro Bonny.

On the foregoing Bill of Indictment it was Endorsed Ignoramus Parker Selby foreman —

and now to wit at a Court held at Dividing Creek the Seventeenth day of March anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty before his Lordships Justices came the aforesaid Negro Jack in his proper person according to a certain Recognizance by him Scunty in that part first acknowledged. And pray that his appearance may be recorded and his Scunty from the Recognizance as may be discharged. Thereupon the said Negro Jacks appearance was recorded and his Scunty of land from the Recognizance as is discharged &c.

Rachelle Price appears here in Court according to her Recognition to Testifie on behalfe of his Lordship against a certain Negro Jack the Negro of Samuel Hitch and was accordingly discharged therefrom &c.

Negro Bonny appears here in Court according to a certain Recognition by her Scunty in that part first acknowledged for her of said Negro Bonny appearance at this Court Testifie for his Lordship ag^t a certain Negro Jack the Slave of a certain Samuel Hitch and was discharged therefrom &c.

Samuel & Henry Lamberson --- Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord proprietary of the province of Maryland held at Dividing Creek in Somerset County the third Tuesday of March to wit the Seventeenth day of the same month anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty before his Lordships Justices the peace in the County aforesaid to keep assynd by the Oath of twelve Jurors being presented that Samuel Lamberson late of Coventry parish in the same County of Somerset planter and Henry Lamberson late of the parish and County aforesaid planter the Eleventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty with force and arms at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid one Hogg of value of twenty pounds of Tobacco the proper Hogg of a certain William Messil then and therewound then and there feloniously did steal take and bear away contrary to the peace of the said Lord proprietary that now is his good rule and government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and provided &c.

Thereupon command is to the Sheriff of the County aforesaid that he should take the said Samuel and Henry Lamberson if he can find them to answer &c. And now to wit all that same Court held for the County aforesaid at Dividing Creek the
