Seventeen hundred and forty with force and arms &c at the parish aff<sup>d</sup> in the County aff<sup>d</sup> within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon a certain James Ellis in the peace of God and the said Lord Proprietary that now is — then and there being an assault did make and him the said James then and there did beat wound and evilly — treat so that of his life it was greatly dispaire and other harms to the same James then and there did to the — grievous damage of him the said James and contrary to the peace of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and government & Whereupon the said Attorney of the said Lord Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary prayeth the Advice of the Court here in the premises and that due process of Law in this part may be made against the said William Conner to answer unto the said Lord Proprietary of and upon the premises &

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of the County <sup>that he</sup> should take the said William Conner if he do answer &c And now to will at that same Court held for the County aforesaid at Dividing Creek the aforesaid Seventeenth day of March anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty above said before the aforesaid Justices came the aforesaid William Conner in his proper person according to a certain Recouerance by him in this part first acknowledged and had a hearing of the Information aforesaid and saith that he cannot deny but that he is guilty of the premises in the Information aforesaid above upon him Imposed in manner and form as by the Information aforesaid above against him supposed and all the premises in the Information aforesaid he doth acknowledge —

Whereupon all and singular the premises aforesaid being seen heard and fully understood It is Considered by the Court where that the aforesaid William Conner pay unto his said Lordship for his fine by the Court here upon him Imposed for and by Causum of the trespass and assault aforesaid whereof in sum as he is bound Two Shillings and six pence Current money of Maryland &c and that the said William Conner be discharged paying same.

This Lordship Somerset &c Be it Remembred that Robert Jenkins Henry Gent Attorney of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is who for the same Lord Proprietary in this part doth prosecute doth come here into the County Court of the same Lord Proprietary held for Somerset County aff<sup>d</sup> at Dividing Creek in the same County the Eighteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty before John Scott Esq<sup>r</sup> and his Associates the same Lord Proprietary his Justices of the same County and for the same Lord Proprietary doth give the Court here to understand and be informed that Ann Willett late of Coventry parish in the said County of Somerset Spinster the sixteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty at the parish aff<sup>d</sup> in the County aff<sup>d</sup> within the Jurisdiction of this Court did commit fornication with a certain person unknown and did permit the same unknown person then and there to have carnall knowledge of her body and then and there to beget a bastard child on the body of her the same Ann to the high displeasure of Almighty God to the evill example of all others in such case offending Contrary to the peace of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and provided &c Whereupon the same Attorney of the same Lord Proprietary
