the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is who for the said Lord Proprietary in this-
John Scarbrough. part prosecuteth doth come here into the County Court of the said Lord Proprietary held for Somerset
County at Dividing Creek in the same County the seventeenth dayes of March in the year of our Lord God one-
thousand seven hundred and forty before John Scott Esq: and his Associates the said Lord Proprietary his Justices
of the same County Court and for the same Lord Proprietary doth give the same Justices to understand and be informed that
John Scarbrough late of Appallows parish in the said County of Somerset heire the fifth day of November in the year of our
Lord God seventeen hundred and forty with force and arms & at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this
in and upon a certain John Dreden in the peace of God and the said Lord Proprietary that now is then and there being an
assault did make and him the said John then and there did beat wound and evillly hurt so that of his life it was greatly
dispaired and other harms to the same John Dreden then and there did to the grievous damage of him the said John Dreden
and contrary to the peace of the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and Government &c
Whereupon the said Attorney of the said Lord Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary prays the Advice of the Court here
in the premises and that due process of Law in this part may be made against the said John Scarbrough to answer unto
the said Lord Proprietary of and upon the premises &c

Thereupon command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take John Scarbrough if he should
be found in his baileywick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body here immediately before the Justices
of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now sitting at Dividing Creek to answer unto his said Lordship of the Information
aforesaid

And afterward to witt the same day and year abovementioned came here before his Lord-
ships Justices the aforesaid John Scarbrough in his proper person and had a hearing of the Information
aforesaid and saith that he will not plead with his said Lordship but submits with a protestation of his Innocency
and puts himself upon the favour of the Court. Whereupon all and singular the premises being seen and
by the Court here fully understood. It is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid John Scarbrough
pay unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his suit by the Court here upon him imposed for and
by reason of the trespass and assault aforesaid whereof in form aforesaid he is bound One Shilling Court
Money of Maryland and that the said John Scarbrough be taken to satisfy his said Lordship of the same and the
