His Lordship Somerset &c The Juries for the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is
for the Body of Somerset County upon their Oath do present that a certain Negro woman —
Negro Diah — named Dinah the Slave of George Hardy of Stepney parish in the said County of Somerset
planter the fifteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and forty with force and arms at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid a certain Outhouse contiguous to and adiacent to
the dwelling house of him the said George Hardy at Stepney parish aforesaid in the County of Somerset Scituate
and being with divers goods and Merchandizes (to wit) Five hundred pounds of Tobacco, one Gun of the Value of
Two hundred pounds of Tobacco, and Eighty and nine sheafs of Flax imbrode, to the Value of three hundred pounds
of Tobacco, of the good and Chattels of the same George Hardy in the same house then being the day and year aforesaid
of her malice prepense and moved by the Instigation of the Devil Voluntarily and feloniously on fire did set
and with the same fire then and there the house aforesaid wherein was then the goods aforesaid did burn and with that fire —
destroy contrary to the peace of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and
Government and against the form of the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and provided.

On the foregoing Bill of Indictment it was Edored True Bill Larker Selby Foreman

And Now to wit the seventeenth day of March anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty at about
then held at Bridgwater in and for the County of Somerset before his Lordships Justices, came the aforesaid
negro woman Dinah, under Custody of John Hardy Sheriff of the County aforesaid, in whose Custody for the same aforesaid
before that time was committed, and to the Bar now here stood in her proper person, and being instantly
asked how she of the felony in the Indictment aforesaid above specified, will hereof acquit herself, the same Negro
woman Dinah, say that she is in no sort then of guilty, and thereupon of good and evil she put her-
self upon the Country. Therefore I immediately sent some thereof the same before the aforesaid Justices
last mentioned herein, and who neither can to recognize her, and the Juries of that same Jury by the aforesaid Sheriff
to this Impanelled to wit David Gold, John Woolsey, William Gray, Edward Brook, Thomas Collett, Geo. Tull,
John Newell, Littleton Townsend, Richard Wallis, John Burnside, and James Stephen Bredale, being called from
who to say the truth of the premises, being elected tried and sworn, upon their Oath say, that the aforesaid Negro
woman Dinah, is not guilty of the felony in the Indictment aforesaid above specified, in manner and form as the aforesaid
Negro woman Dinah, for herself above by pleading alledged, nor never herself by Question aforesaid did withdraw —

Whereupon all and singular the premises aforesaid being seen and heard and fully understood It is Considered
by the Court here that the aforesaid Negro woman Dinah be quiet and goe hence without day.

Negro Rose, Caesar and Robin, all being bound by Recognizance to attend this Court in Order to give Evidence on behalfe
of his Lordship against Negro Dinah appear hereai Court and are discharged therefrom.
