 we have appointed you or any three or two of you to be our Comissioners to Examine Evidences on  
 behalfe of a certain James Robinson of the County of Somers<sup>et</sup> Clerk in Relation to the bounds of a tract  
 of Land called Glandvilles Sott or the bounds or division <sup>Bound of</sup> of any other Lands on which the said Glandvilles  
 Sott may depend We therefore Require you or any three or two of you at some time and Place as  
 to you or any three or two of you shall seem convenient you meet on the said Land called Glandvilles  
 Sott or any other Lands on which the bounds of the said Glandvilles Sott may depend You first  
 haveing taken your Oaths on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God According to act of assembly  
 in such case made and provided) and there have to come before you or any three or two of you all  
 such Evidences as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated by the said Complainant  
 or Deft: if any and that you or any three or two of you Examine them upon their Corporall  
 Oaths to be by you or any three or two of you Administered on the holy Evangelist of Almighty  
 God in the Presence of the Complainant or Deft: if any touching the truth or Remembrance of  
 their knowledge or any thing that may Relate to the Cause aforesaid and that Reducing the severall  
 Depositions ~~in writing~~ into writing you send the same together with this our Comission under your  
 or any three or two of your hands and seals to us to our County Court of Somerset with all convenient  
 speed Witness Robert King Gent. Chief Justice of our said Court the twenty second day of August  
 Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty . . . . .

And Now to wit the third Tuesday of March being the seventeenth day of the same month  
 Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty At a Court then held before his Lordships Justices  
 dividing Creek in and for the County of Somerset came John Woolford and Joseph Gillips two  
 of the Gentlemen nominated in the above Comission and made Return thereof enclosed with  
 the severall depositions thereto annexed in form following . . . . .
