Tunstall was a talking about the line trees that was marked between the C. Tunstall and the land belonging now to Mr. Robinson and Tunstall told this deponent that make it was Capt. Smith marked them and further saith not. *Luis Rigsby*

Richard Chambers of Somerset County aged about eighty three years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposeth and saith that he has often heard that there was a survey made by Thomas Wilson Esq; Guardian to Capell King both of the County of D. to Ryng a devision all line between Thomas Wilson and Capt. Smiths Land and this deponent further saith that he has often times seen a cedar post set up at the Ingin Landing marked the same course as the line tree here goes and this deponent further saith that on a survey made by Capell King of the C. County he heard Capt. Tunstall call to the Surveyor and told him he went within his Old marked tree and shewed them to the Surveyor and this deponent further saith that he has heard a certain Ellick Stalls of the County of D. always allow them marked trees to be the devision and the cedar Post between him and Capell King and he believed the cedar post was set up by the Jury for to decide them and further saith not. *Richard Chambers.*

Daniel Burman of Somerset County aged about sixty years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposeth and saith that when he was a servant to Capt. John Tunstall of the C. County that the C. Tunstall and John Colk of the C. County Ryng a line a cross the point from the Gut to the River about a farnes length above the line as Old Ghebus swore to and this deponent was ordered by Capt. Tunstalls Overseer to make a gate on the line and the fence was made on the line and further saith not ~
