Richard Chambers of Somerset County aged about fifty three years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deponeth and saith that he has often heard that there was a Jury called by Thomas Wilson Guardian to Capell King both of the County of Wiltshire to Run a divisional Line between Thomas Wilson and Capt. Smiths Land and this deponent further saith that he has often times seen a Cedar Post set up at the Inquin Landing marked the same Course as the Sine trees were and this deponent further saith that on a View made by Capell King of the County he heard Capt. Tunstall call to the Surveyor and told him he went within the Old marked trees and showed them to the Surveyor and this deponent further saith that he has heard a certain Ellick Hall of the County of Wiltshire always allow them marked trees to be the division and the Cedar Post between him and Capell King and he believed the Cedar post was set up by the Jury for to decide them and further saith not. *Richard Chambers.*
