And afterwards to witt the seventeenth day of March anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and forty the said Richard Knight present here in Court in his proper person, and upon this the same Richard at the prayer of the *vs.* is committed into the Custody of the Sheriff of the County *vs.* there to remain until the *vs.* George Gale of his Damages aforesaid should be *vs.* of fully satisfied, the said Sheriff present here in Court took Charge of the said Richard accordingly *vs.*

John Wildman late of Somerset County planter and Catherine his wife if they should be found in his bailiwick and them should safe keep so that he might have their bodies -

before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Dividing Creek in the same County - the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty to answer unto Archibald Mackneal of a plea of trespass upon the case. And the same day is given to the *vs.* Archibald here *vs.*

At which day here came the *vs.* Archibald Mackneal by his Attorney *vs.* and the Sheriff to witt John Standy Gent. now here returned that he had taken the *vs.* John Wildman & Catherine his wife whose bodies here at this day he had ready to answer the *vs.* Archibald Mackneal of the *vs.* plea, as to him it was commanded.

And afterwards to witt the same day and Year above said last mentioned at Dividing Creek before his Lordships came the aforesaid John Wildman and Catherine his wife by William Arbuckle their Attorney and the *vs.* Archibald Mackneal then and there his writ *vs.* against the *vs.* John Wildman and Catherine his wife did not prosecute with effect but voluntarily permitted this Suit to be discontinued.

Therefore afterwards to witt the same day by direction of the Justice here were adjudged to the same John Wildman and Catherine his wife for their Costs and Charges by them about their defence in that part sustained according to the form of the statute in such case lately made and provided and the *vs.* Archibald in mercy. and that the *vs.* John Wildman and Catherine have thereof *vs.*
