Therefore by consent of the parties &c. it is considered that the afo. George Gale recover against the afo. Richard Knight his damages &c. to the afo. four hundred pound money of maryland by the same Richard in sum afo. acknowledged as also three hundred and sixty six pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges &c. to the same George at his request by the court here of the Agent of the parties afo. adjudged which certain damages in the whole amounts to four hundred pound money of maryland and three hundred and sixty six pounds of tobacco and the afo. Richard in mercy &c.

And afterwards to witt the seventeenth day of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty the said Richard Knight present here in Court in his proper person, and upon him the same Richard at the prayer of the Geo. is committed into the custody of the Sheriff of the County afo. thereto remaine until the afo. George Gale of his damage aforesaid should be heard of fully satisfied, the said Sheriff present herein Court took charge of the said Richard accordingly &c.

command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take wt: John Wildman et ux. John Wildman late of Somerset County planter and Catherine his wife if they should be found in his bailey or ch and them should safe keep so that he might have their bodies - before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek in the same County - the third Tuesday of March anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty to answer unto Archibald McNeal of a plea of trespass upon the afo. and the same day is given to the afo. Archibald here &c.

At which day here came the afo. Archibald McNeal by his Attorney &c. and the Sheriff to witt John Sladey gentl. now here returned that he had taken the afo. John Wildman & Catherine his wife whose bodies here at this day he had ready to answer the afo. Archibald McNeal of the afo. plea, as to him it was commanded.

And afterwards to witt the same day and year above said last mentioned at dividing Creek before his Lordships came the aforesaid John Wildman and Catherine his wife by William Arbuckle their attorney and the afo. Archibald McNeal then and there his writ afo. against the afo. John Wildman and Catherine his wife did not prosecute with effect but voluntarily permitted this suit to be discontinued.

Therefore afterward to witt the same day by direction of the Justices here were adjudged to the same John Wildman and Catherine his wife for their costs and charges by whom about their defense in that part sustained according to the form of the Statute in such case lately made and provided and the afo. Archibald in mercy. and that the afo. John and Catherine have thereof payment &c.
