And whereupon the said Thomas by Francis Allen his Attorney complains that whereas the said Joseph the  
Twenty eighth day of Nov<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom<sup>r</sup> Seventeen hundred and thirty six at the County of Somerset aforesaid within  
the Jur<sup>r</sup> of this Court was Indebted unto the said Thomas in Seven pounds fourteen shillings Court  
money of Maryland it being the ballance of an account to the said Thomas by the said Joseph before  
that time due owing and unpaid and being so thereof Indebted the said Joseph in Consideration  
thereof the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid upon himself did assume and to the said Thomas  
then and there did faithfully promise that he the said Joseph the said Seven pounds fourteen  
shillings to the said Thomas when he should be therunto requested he would well and faithfully  
pay and settent Neverthelēp the said Joseph his promise and assumption aforesaid in forme aforesaid  
made nothing regarding but plotting and fraudulently intending the said Thomas in that  
part craftily and subtilly to deceivē and degradē the said seven pounds fourteen shillings to  
the said Thomas tho' often by him thereto requested hath not paid but the same to him  
hitherto to pay hath required and still doth refuse and deny to the damage of the said Thomas  
of ten pounds money aforesaid and thereof he brings suit . . . . . Bledges H. J. D. & R. Ps.

At which day here came the A<sup>d</sup>: Thomas Ennalls by his attorney A<sup>d</sup>: and the sheriff to wit.  
John Hande Gent: nowhere returned that he had taken the A<sup>d</sup>: Joseph Lewis whose body hereat  
this day he had ready to answer the A<sup>d</sup>: Thomas Ennalls of the A<sup>d</sup>: plea as to him it was commanded  
Whereupon came hereinto Court a certain John Burnall A<sup>r</sup>t<sup>r</sup> of Somerset County planter  
in his proper person and undertook for the said Joseph Lewis Likewise the said Joseph Lewis  
present herein came in his proper person abjured upon himself that if it should happen  
that judgment in the plea A<sup>d</sup>: should be rendered for the same Thomas against him the said  
Joseph or that he the same Joseph should be therein convicted that then he the said Joseph should  
pay and satisfy unto the said Thomas the Judgment of this Court thereupon or render his body in  
Execution of such Judgment to the prison of the sheriffs of the County A<sup>d</sup>: in satisfaction thereof or  
that he the same John Burnall will do the same for him &c . . .

And the R. D. Joseph Lewis in his proper person cometh and defendeth the force and injury  
whenas
