Evidence for the Defendant. Nathaniel Capper Jr. being sworn by the Commissioners on the
Holy Evangelist of Almighty God aged about 56 years to the best of his remembrance that he came
over Patsy Creek where the Judges were settling the boundaries of the Land between Francis Hamblin
and John Patsy and that the Judge came of the marsh where he understood that they had settle a
boundary and was running a line through the woods what course he did not know but marsh trees as
they went further saith not.

April the 26th 1740/

Capt: Charles Rachliss aged about forty four years or there abouts being
sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God declaras this deponent that he was about to purchase
Francis Hamblins Land and that the said Hamblin carried him round the Land called Winchester
and that he saw severall trees marked for boundaries and line trees and coming down the line between
the said Patsy and Hamblin that Hamblin told the deponent that this is the line the Land Justice
Run Between Patsy and him and then pointing a cross down towards the Creek that the Judge
settled the boundary down there by a small creek but he was sure he was wronged by the Judges in there
settling the Boundary there for it was not there and that his pretensions were better then he thought for by
Reason that his Boundary was lower down towards the mouth the said Creek if he had his Right to
had but as his paper directed but the said deponent told Hamblin he would buy no land in
dispute further this deponent saith not.
