Command was given to the sheriffs of Somerset County that he should take John Bowell late of Somerset County planter if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty to satisfy James Stephen Bredell Adm<sup>r</sup> of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits which were of Isaac Bredell dec<sup>d</sup>: at the time of his death who died Intestate of five pounds ten Shillings in Bills of Credit and One Guinea in Gold. and three hundred and thirty eight pounds of tobacco which to the same James Stephen Bredell in the same Court before his said Lordships Justices at dividing Creek were adjudged for his damages. which he had by Occasion of a certain promise and Assumption by the same John to the same James Stephen made and not performed whereof he is Convict. and the same day is given to the Ed: James Stephen here &c . . . . .
