

Edmond Capper J. C. of Godfrey's progle  
 Duncann Murray  
 Command was given to the sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Duncann Murray if he should be found in his bailiwick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty to satisfy Edmond Capper J. C. as well late of Somerset County planter Administrator of all and Singular the goods Chattles Rights and Credits which were of Godfrey's progle lately deceased at the time of his death with the testament of the said Godfrey Anceore of one hundred and Seventy one pounds of tobacco which to the same Edmond Capper J. C. in his Lordships County Court of Somerset before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek by discretion of the same Justices were adjudged for his Costs and Charges which he sustained in a certain plea of trespass upon the Case by the same Edmond against the said Duncann in the same Court Impetrated according to the form of the statute thereof made and provided against parties plaintiffs which their writts in such manner of pleas doe not prosecute or in the same should be precluded whereof he is Convict &c. And the same day is given to the aforesaid Edmond here &c.

All which day here came the aforesaid Edmond Capper J. C. in his proper person and the sheriff to witte John Handy Gent now here returned that he had taken the aforesaid Duncann Murray whose body here at this day he had ready to satisfy the aforesaid Edmond Capper of the Costs as to him it was Commanded &c.

Sevin Gale Esq. Somerset sh. Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the  
 Richard Ellison Executor of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To  
 Geo. Willcox the Sheriff of Somerset County greeting we Command you that of the  
 Goods and Chattles which were of George Willcox late of Somerset County (Whington otherwise called  
 George Willcox of Somerset County Gentleman in the hands of Richard Ellison of Somerset County  
 Taylor and Elizabeth his wife Executrix of the testament and Last will of the aforesaid George Remaining  
 to be Administred in your bailiwick you make as well a certain debt of Seventy four pounds Currant  
 money of Maryland which Colonel Sevin Gale in our County Court of Somerset before our Justices  
 at dividing Creek Recovered against the aforesaid George as Two hundred and Seventy four pounds of  
 tobacco which to him the same Sevin in our same Court were adjudged for his damages which he had  
 by Occasion of the detention of the same debt and that you have that money and tobacco before our  
 Justices of our next Court to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March then next following  
 to satisfy the aforesaid Sevin Gale of the debt and damages aforesaid whereof the aforesaid George in his life was  
 Convict. And Whereupon it was considered in our same Court that the aforesaid Sevin Gale should have  
 Execution against the aforesaid Richard Ellison and Elizabeth his wife of the debt and damages aforesaid of  
 the Goods and Chattles of the aforesaid George in said aforesaid by the default of the same Richard Ellison and  
 Elizabeth and that you have then and there this Will with the aforesaid John Scott Gent. one of our Justices  
 of our said Court the twenty sixth day of November in the twenty sixth year of our Dominion &c. Anno  
 Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty. all
