Command was given to the sheriff of Somerset County that he should take Duncan of Godfrey spragle Murray if she should be found in his bailewick and him should safe keep so that he might have his body before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at dividing Creek the third Tuesday of March Anno Domini thousand seven hundred and forty to satisfie Edmond Capper & as well late of Somerset County planter Administrator of all and singular the goods chattles Rights and Credits which were of Godfrey spragle lately deceased at the time of his death with the testament of the said Godfrey annexed of one hundred and seventy one pounds of tobacco which to the same Edmond Capper & in his Lordships County Court of Somerset before the Justices thereof at dividing Creek by discretion of the same Justices were adjudged for his costs and charges which he sustained in a certain p[ro]le of his pass upon the case by the same Edmond against the said Duncan in the same Court Impetrated according to the form of the statute thereof made and provided against parties plaintiffs which their writs in such manner of p[ro]le doe not prosecute or in the same should be precluded wherof he is convicted & And the same day is given to the afo[rm'd] Edmond hereof

All which day here came the afo[rm'd] Edmond Capper & in his proper person and the sheriff to wit John Randy gent now here returned that he had taken the afo[rm'd] Duncan Murray whose body here at this day he find ready to satisfie the afo[rm'd] Edmond Capper of the p[ro]le as to him it was commanded &

Geo: Wilcox. the Sheriff of Somerset County greeting we command you that of the Goods and Chattles which were of Geo: Wilcox late of Somerset County Chisington otherwise called George Wilcox of Somerset County Gentleman in the hands of Richard Ellison of Somerset County ~ Taylor and Elizabeth his wife Executrix of the testament and last will of the afo[rm'd] George Remaining to be Administred in your bailewick you make as well a certain debt of Seventy four pounds Court mony of Maryland which Colonel Levin Hale in our County Court of Somerset before our Justices at dividing Creek recovered against the afo[rm'd] George as Two hundred and Seventy four pounds of tobacco which to him the same Levin in ourr ams Court were adjudged for his damage which he had by Occasion of the detencion of the same debt and that you have that mony and tobacco before our Justices of our next Court to be held at dividing Creek the third tuesday of March then next following to satisfie the afo[rm'd] Levin Hale of the debt and damages afo[rm'd] whereof the afo[rm'd] George in his life was convict. And Whereupon it was considered in ourr ams Court that the afo[rm'd] Levin Hale should have Execution against the afo[rm'd] Richard Ellison and Elizabeth his wife of the debt and damages afo[rm'd] of the Goods and Chattles of the afo[rm'd] George in sum afo[rm'd] by the default of the same Richard Ellison and Elizabeth and that you have then and there this Writ witness John Scott Gent: one of our Justices of our said Court the twenty sixth day of November in the twenty sixth year of our Dominion & anno Domini thousand one thousand seven hundred and forty. - - - - - att
