Bosc Guardian } and prayd that she may be permitted to chose a certain David Bolle of Somerset County planter as her Guardian
which is by the Court hereunto her granted . . . Thereupon the said Ann Venables present hereinto Court in her proper person
makes choice of the said David Bolle as her Guardian accordingly. Whereupon the said David Bolle is ordered to take unto his
care and protection the aforesaid Orphan and her Estate Real and that he give good security for to comply with the Guardianship
aforesaid &c. Thereupon the said David Bolle with Thomas Gillis and David Willson all of Somerset County gentlemen his
Security all present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto the said Ann Venables the aforesaid Orphan
in one hundred pounds curr^t money of Maryland of their Bodys goods or Chattels lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to
the use of the said Ann Venables her heirs or assigns if it happen that the said David Bolle the aforesaid Guardian do not comply with the
same in relation to such Guardian ships as aforesaid and do not deliver up unto the aforesaid Orphan all her Estate real that he shall have in his hands
and possession peaceable and quietely when ever the same shall be legally required

unto him granted he giving security to comply with the act of Assembly in such case made and provided for . . .

Whereupon the said Edward Rownd with James Martin and Samuel Hopkins of Somerset County Gentlemen
his security all present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Right hon^{ble}
the Lord Proprietor of Maryland in the full and just sum off two pounds current money of said Province of their Bodie goods
or Chattels lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors If it happen
that Edward Rownd do not pay and satisfy unto the Sheriff of the County aforesaid for the time being fifty shillings current
money of the province aforesaid yearly and every year he shall keep such Ordinary or house of Entertainment as aforesaid

Likewise the same Edward Rownd with his aforesaid James Martin and Samuel Hopkins his Security aforesaid present here in Court in their
proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto his said Lordship the Lord Proprietor in forty pounds curr^t money of Maryland of
their Bodys goods or Chattels lands or tenements severally to be made and levied to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors if it
happen that the said Edward Rownd do not keep good rules and orders and do suffer idle loose and disorderly persons to lippole hym or
commit disorders or other irregularities in his Ordinary or house of Entertainment during the time that he shall keep the same Contrary to
the true intent and meaning of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided for . . .
