Whereas it has been made appear to me the Subscriber one of his  
Lordships Justices of the Peace that Lawrence Mainamara in debt to  
John Moore in the sum of Two Hundred and forty Pounds, as also that  
the said Lawrence is absconded from the Place of his late abode & Run away  
These are therefore in his said Lordships Name to Command you to  
Give attachment against the Effects of the said Lawrence as well to satisfy the  
sum of Two Hundred and forty Pounds of Tobacco as also the present Costs  
that shall accrue thereon Pursuant to the Directions of an Act of Assembly in such  
Cases made and Provided, fail not and for so doing this shall be your Warrant  
Given under my hand y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Day of May 1717 — *[Signature]*

To the Clerk of the Co.

Whereupon I was Commanded the Sheriff that of the Goods Chattels &  
Credits of the said Lawrence Mainamara on his Realty with being he should attach  
as well the sum of Two Hundred and forty Pounds of Tobacco & Charges as for Sum  
Pounds of Tobacco for Costs that had accrued and that further may accrue in Prosecution  
of the same and when those are he had attached or any Part thereof that he should  
have it before the Justices of the Lord Proprietary of his Next County Court to be held at  
Charles Town on the second Tuesday in June Next then and there to be condemned  
according to Law and for the oaths of the said John Moore unless the said Lawrence shall  
Come then and there by himself or Lawfull Attorney and answer unto the said John  
Moore of all things in dispute upon the Case and that by good & lawful men of his County  
he should make known to the Sheriff or persons in whose hands he made the  
same Attachment that he or they should appear before the Justices of the said  
Lord Proprietary at the Place and Time afo<sup>r</sup> to show Cause if any he or they  
have why the sum in their or any of their hands attached should not be condemned
