 of Tobacco for the that had Annexed and that for the <sup>same</sup> reason in Execution of the  
 Premises, and when the same he had attached or any part thereof that he should have  
 it before the Justices of the said Proprietary of his Next County Court to be held at the  
 Town on the second Tuesday in June Next then and there to be condemned according  
 to Law to and for the use of the said John unless the said Edward should come therein  
 there by himself or Lawfull Attorney and Answer unto the said John of a plea of Trespass  
 upon the Case and that by God and Lawfull men of his daily writ he should make known  
 to the Person or Persons in whose hands hee had made the same Attachment that he  
 shoud they be and appear before the Justices of the said Lord Propriary at the place and time  
 to show Cause if any hee he or they have why the sum in their Obedience of their hands attached  
 should not be condemned according to Law and the said John have the Execution of the  
 said Law hee should Execute that Writ that hee should make known to the Justices at the  
 Time and place aforesaid, and that hee should have them and their that Writ and the names of  
 those before whom hee should make the same known &c.
