By his Certain Writing obligatory with the seal of him the said Charles Bracycroft
Sealed and here in Court produced whose date is the day and year aforesaid he has obliged
himself to be held and firmly bound unto the said Joseph Adams in the sum of
Fifty five pounds Sterling money of Great Britain as aforesaid to be paid to the said Joseph
Adams when thereunto lawfully required. Nevertheless the
Charles Bracycroft altho' often requested the said sum of Fifty five pounds Sterling
as aforesaid or any part thereof to the said Joseph Adams hath not paid or in any sort
Contented but the same to him the said Joseph Adams to pay or in any sort to content
hath hitherto altogether refused and still doth refuse to the damage of the said Joseph
Adams one hundred pounds Sterling as aforesaid and therefore suit is brought for the
same

And the said Charles Bracycroft by Thomas Clark his attorney comes and
thence and by jury when the said Bracycroft hearing of the Writing obligatory and it is
read unto him and he also Bracycroft hearing of the condition of the said Writing
obligatory and it is read unto him in these words following to wit

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound
Charles Bracycroft do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said
Joseph Adams his certain Attorney Executors Admors or Assigns the sum of
Twenty Nine pounds Three shillings Sterling at or upon the first day of June
Next ensuing the date hereof with legal interest for the same then the above
obligation is to be void else to remain in full force and Virtue in Law but if default
be made in the payment of the said sum of Twenty Nine pounds Three shillings
Sterling then I empower any attorney in any Court of Record in the Kingdom of
Great Britain France or Ireland or within the Province of Maryland or the his
Majesties Dominions to appear for me at the suit of the above mentioned Joseph
Adams or his Receiver a Declaration on the above obligation and thereupon to bring
Judgment by Nil dicit Cognovit Actionem Nonsum Infirmatus or other
wise lawfully believing all the wrong that may happen upon this said judgment
being so executed for the use or in any of the proceedings thereunto relating

the said Joseph Adams recover against the said Charles Bracycroft his Heirs and his
Damages by reason of detaining that Debt of four hundred and twenty eight
Pounds of Tobacco to the said Joseph Adams by the Court here adjudged and
the said Charles in money 1747
