John Elom by his attorney apd. pray that the said Plaintiff, to their Declaration apd. against them may answer and because the said Plaintiff to the Declaration apd. <sup>therein</sup> named John Elom does not answer nor the Action, apd. in any wise gainway where, by the said John Elom remains against the said Plaintiff, herupon without defence.

It is therefore considered by the Court here that the said John Elom doth owe against the said Plaintiff the Damages by occasion of the Services (and which by the Justices of the Court here are apd. to Ninepounds Currency as also Two Hundred & Sixty Five pounds of Grace for their Costs & Charges by him abord their suit in this part paid out and Expended to the same John Elom or their agent in summa by the Court here adjudged and the same Plaintiff in money &c.

Chas Samuel Luckett vs John Elom 3-5-7 June  
John Elom Junr Judgment

Charles County Jr: John Elom Junior late of Charles County Planter was attcked to issue unto Samuel Luckett of a sum of Six p<sup>s</sup> upon the Case and so forth.

And whereas on the same day the said Samuel by Jeremiah Grace his attorney complained that whereas the said John Elom lent the Plaintiff Day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven Hundred and forty five at Charles County aforesaid was indebted to the said Samuel in the sum of three Pounds five Shillings and even one half Penny Currency for such moneys as hee did pay to him by Properly in an amount as by the Particular Account thereof herewith to Court brought may appear and being otherwise Indebted to the said John Elom in Consideration whereof afterwards on the day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid upon himselfe spake and to the said Samuel then and there faithfully Promised that he the said John Elom Junr. the said sum of three Pounds five Shillings and even one half Penny Currency to the said Samuel when hee came of age he should be requested well and truly would Content and pay. Nevertheless the said John Elom his Sonnes and aumption apd. not regarding outrinding and fraudulently Intending the same Samuel in this part Craftily and Suckily to decease and defraud the said John the said sum of three Pounds five Shillings even one half Penny Currency or any part thereof to the said Samuel hath not paid nor him for the same in any sort Contented Altho' he aforesaid John afterward on the first day of August in the year and at the Court aforesaid by the same Samuel was requested but the same to him to pay or him for the same in any sort to Content hath either to altogether Refused and still doth Refuse to the Damages of the said Samuel six pounds Ten Shillings Currency and therefore suit is brought and so forth.
