Meaning of the Act of Assembly Concerning ordinary and for the  
better Regulating and Ordering and Ordering Keepers within this Province  
To be paid out to Sheriffs of Killings Currency

William Bryan on his Motion to the Court is admitted to keep  
ordinary at his House at Bryan Town he giving Security according to the Direction  
of the Act of Assembly in those Cases lately made & Provided

Whereupon into Court there  
in his proper Person comes the said William Bryan and acknowledges himself  
to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in  
the sum of Forty Pounds Current Money of Maryland and also in like  
Manner came William Hoildleton and Samuel Hanson and acknowledge  
themselves to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship in the  
sum of Twenty Pounds Current Money each which sums they and every of them  
swornly yielded and granted should be made and seen on their and  
every of their Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the Use of his  
said Lordship his Heirs and Assigns

On Condition that the said  
William Bryan do keep good Rules and orders and do not suffer  
Jails Laos or disorderly Persons to supple Game or Commit other disorders  
or Irregularities Contrary to the true Intent and meaning of the Act of  
Assembly Concerning ordinary and for the better Regulating  
and Ordering the Keepers within this Province

To be paid out to Sheriffs of Killings Curr.

Jervis Hair Presented by his Master John Brooks for Runaway  
Time who makes Oath that he Absconded himself four days from John Chapman and  
his late Master and 26 days from the said John Brooks and that he Expended in Seeking him  
up four Hundred and Eighty one Pounds of Tobacco

Whereupon he is  
Adjudged to serve five Days for the same and five Months for the four Hundred and Eighty  
Pounds of Tobacco

Samuel Middleton Informing the Court that Ann Willson formerly  
adherent to Mrs Ann M. Church was adjudged to serve for Runaway time & for  
fourteen years to Comence last June and the Period there of being burnt it is ordered  
that the said Ann Willson serve the said Samuel the said term she being & assigned  
to him by the said Ann M. Church
