Surving Bondman has just cause to fear that the said Estate will be demanded of him, who is already threatened by the Heirs of this said Leman, to prevent which Impending Danger your Petitioner Humbly pray your Worships that in your great wisdom, and tender Care of the Orphans aforesaid as well as the Administration of Common Justice to your Petitioner, would cause the said Mac Nale to procure such Bonds that thereby your Petitioner may be relieved therefrom, and he accordingly bound shall ever pay — November 1727 —

On Reciting of which Petition it was Ordained that summons issue for John Mac Nale to answer the Premises, and the said John Mac Nale of appearing according to Summons and nothing appearing to the Court to oblige him to come hither Counter Security wherefore therewithal Petition is Dismissed —

James Freeman on his Petition to the Court is admitted to keep Ordinary at his house in Charles Town giving Security according to the Directions of the Act of Assembly in those Cases late made and provided.

Whereupon into Court  
herein his Proper Person Comes the aforesaid James Freeman, and acknowledged him self to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of Forty Pounds current money of Maryland and also in Item another sum of Barton Hangersford and Henry Carter of same County and acknowledged heretofore to owe and stand Justly Indebted unto his said Lordship In the sum of Twenty Pounds Likewise each which sum they and every of them severally yielded & granted should be made and levied on their and every of their Goods & Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors —

In Condition that the said James Freeman do keep good Rule and orders and does not suffer loose or disorderly Persons to Sipple Game or commit other Disorders or Irregularities contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of the Act of Assembly Concerning Ordinary and further Regulating Inn Holders and Ordinary Keepers within this Province —
