Whereupon into Court herein his Proper Person Came the said John Hanson youngest of Charles County Gentleman and Acknowledged himself to owe and stand shortly Indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of Two Pounds Sterling Current money which sum he yielded and granted, should and might be made answer on his Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements for the doing his said Lordship his Heirs & Successors
