Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the said Philip fined one Hundred Pounds of Tobacco for his offence afo^{re} by the Court here adjudged and that the said Philip be taken 26 a

Whereupon into Court in his proper Person Comes William Middleton of Charles County Merchant and becomes Pledge and security for the said Philip to pay the fine afo^{re} as also the several fees due in due to the officers and ministers of the Court hereby Question of the Premises
