 answer unto Ralph Falchner & Company of a plue of Goods
 upon the Case and so forth.

And Whereas upon the same Ralph Falchner & Company by Edmund Phane,
 their attorney Complain that whereas the said John Nail the Twenty Sixth
 day of August in the year our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty Six
 at Charles County aforesaid was indebted to said Falchner & Com. in the sum of Three
 Pounds Threeshillings and fourpence Current and one pound and eight pence Sterling
 for such Articles as by properly in an account aforesaid the Particular account
 thereof withouts to best brought may appear and has and other being so
 thereof made in Consideration thereof aforesaid to wit the day and year aforesaid
 at the County aforesaid upon himself affirmed and to the said Ralph Falchner & Com.
 then and there faithfully Promised that he the said John Nail the said sum of Three pounds
 Three shillings and fourpence Current and one pound and eight pence Sterling
 would well and truly content and pay when the same aforesaid he should
 be required. Nevertheless the said John his Promise and Assumption aforesaid
 not regarding but mislaid and fraudulently Intending the said Falchner &
 Company in this part chaffy and subtilty to deceive and defraud the said sum of
 Three pounds Three shillings and fourpence Current and one pound and eight
 pence Sterling or any part thereof to the said Falchner & Company hath not paid nor
 any way Contented aforesaid so do the said John was thereto affianced to wit
 the first day of September in the year and at the County aforesaid by the said Falchner &
 Company required whereon they say they are the Worse and have damage
 to the sum of three pounds Threeshillings and fourpence Current and two pound
 One shilling and fourpence Sterling and therefore they bring suit before
