County afo. that Thomas Warren is justly indebted unto him in the sum of Six
Hundred and Seventy nine pounds of Tobacco, and that the said Thomas Warren
is Runaway

These are therefore in his Lordships Name to command you immediately
upon Receipt hereof to issue attachment against the Effects of the said
(Warren)
