Samuel Hanson vs Thomas Angley Judgment of the Court of Chancery

Charles County vs Thomas Angley late of Charles County for the said Samuel Hanson paid of a plea of Judgments upon the case & forth

And Whereupon the said Samuel by some late base his attorney (or) plan for the return of the said Thomas on the twenty ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty seven at Charles County aforesaid was admitted unto the said Samuel in the sum of one thousand six hundred and forty four pounds for divers particular lying properly in account as by a particular account thereof hereunto introduced brought which appears and the said Thomas being sworn of Oath did in fact and hereof afterwards to wit the day and year aforesaid in the County aforesaid upon himself affirmed & so became demand then and there faithfully promised that but the said Thomas should receive one thousand six hundred and forty four pounds of Tobacco to the said Samuel or would not lawfully content and pay when thereunto afterwards he should be required Nevertheless the said Thomas his Promise and assumption aforesaid in the last regarding but minding and fraudulently absconding him the said Samuel in this part craftily and cunningly to conceal and suppress the said Thomas the said sum of one thousand six hundred and forty four pounds of Tobacco or any part thereof to the said Samuel he hath not paid or in any sort contented at this date the said Thomas as was on the thirtieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty seven before and since at Charles County aforesaid by the said Samuel requested but the said Thomas as he had sum of one thousand six hundred and forty four pounds of Tobacco or any part thereof to the said Samuel to pay or in any sort contented hath rather to altogether refuse and sheweth Refuse to the payment of the said Samuel three thousand two hundred and eighty eight pounds of Tobacco and therefore he brings suit &c
