Damages by Judson, of obtaining that Debt to just Honor, and Eighty
one Counts of Tobacco to the same John of his ap. by the Court here
defined and Judged and the said Jeremiah in 1747 &c.

Sheweth Luke Morris Debtor Judgment Bond
vs
John Matheron Judgment of Nonsum Informatus

Charles County vs. John Matheron late of Charles County in the Province of
Maryland Planter otherwise called John Matheron of Charles County Province
of Maryland Planter was summoned to answer unto Lubert Morris of the City of
Philadelphia Merchant of plea that he owrd unto him the sum of Eighteen
Eighteen Counts Eighteen Shillings Sterling or money of great Britain, which to
him he owes and unjustly detains and doeth.

And thereupon the same Luke by his attorney saith that
whereas the said John on the Thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one
Thousand seven Hundred and forty seven at Charles County ap. by his certain
Writing obligatory with the seal of him the said John sealed and hereunto
produced whose date is the day and year ap. acknowledged himself to be bound
firmly bound unto the said Luke in the sum of Eighteen pounds Eighteen Shillings
Sterling money ap. to the said Luke when thereunto afterwards he should be
Required. Nevertheless the said John often Required the said sum of Eighteen
Counts Eighteen Shillings Sterling money ap. or any part thereof to him the said
Luke to pay or in any sort to content hath either to do together Required and it is the
ap. to the damage of him the said Luke Morris thirty seven Counts sixteen
Shillings Sterling money ap. therefore due to be payed to the said Luke Morris.

And the ap. John by Henry Darnall his attorney Comes & Defends the force
& injury when &c. and prayes hearing of the Writing obligatory and it is read
unto him he doth praye absolving of the condition of the same Writing and it is
read unto him in these words viz.

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound John
Matheron, do and shall well truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Luke
Morris his certain sum of nine pounds nine
Shillings Sterling Money of great Britain, at or before the first day of October
Next ensuing the date hereof with legal interest for the same then the above
obligation
