Ordered that the Sheriff W. Williams, John Ligon, 600 Shaves on account of Edw:<sup>d</sup> Hutchins and 200 Shaves on credit, forwards Richm<sup>ts</sup> out of the fines and amerc.

Patrik Ironenkin's Motion to the Court to be allowed <sup>the</sup> Shaves for keeping a poor Child on the last year

Ordered by the Court here that Edward Brady Esq<sup>r</sup> present here in Court in his proper Person Enter into Recognizance in the sum of Forty Pounds Current Money of Maryland with one good Security in the like sum for his true and Brady's appearance at the Next Court of Oyer and Terminer to be held at Richm<sup>ts</sup> and that Delivery there to be taken such an oath as shall be required against him on behalf of her Lordship to keep the Peace and be of good Behaviour towards all his Majesty's Subjects and stand to and abide the Judgment of said Court and not depart without leave thereof

Whereupon into Court here in his proper Person comes the said Edward Brady and Acknowledges himself to owe and stand boundly indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of Forty Pounds Current Money of Maryland and also in like manner to one Hugh Long and Acknowledges himself to owe and stand boundly indebted unto his said Lordship in the sum of Forty Pounds like Money which sum he prays be required and granted should be made and paid of their and every of their body's Goods and Chattels and lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his Heirs or Successors

On Condition that the said Edward Brady do and shall make his personal appearance here before the Judges of the said Court at Charles Town on the Twenty fifth day of April next and answer what shall be demanded by the said Hugh Long and Hugh Long on behalf of the Lord Proprietary and stand to and abide the Judgment of said Court and not depart the Court without leave thereof and in the meantime keep the peace and be of good Behaviour to all his Lordships good People

Whereupon the said William being present here in Court here being asked whether he be guilty of the premises aforesaid on him imposed oath that he is no wise thereof guilty but for that he will not contend with his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in that behalf humbly submits himself to the Court

Therefore it is considered that the said was seized on suffer corporal Punishment according to the direction of the Act of (aforesaid)
