towards plantation —

your Honors will give your good ffigrant that the said Path may be kept open by
the Neighbors making Gates convenient to the said Path therbying no other
way thenceabout so direct and convenient as the said Path as their plantations
have Stopt up and your Honors petitioners in duty bound shall ever pray
