John *Whereupon* into Court here in his proper person Came Richard Coffey of Charles County Planter and became Pledge and Security for the aforesaid John that if it should happen that the afo. John in the Plea aforesaid should be convicted that then the said Richard Coffey yield and granted that as well the Debts as all Damages which to the said Sampson Maxwell in this Part should be adjudged of his Lands and Chattels should be made and Lived to and for the Use of the said Sampson Maxwell if it should happen the said John Holden the Debts and Damages aforesaid to the said Sampson should not pay or his Body into the Custody of the shd by Treason the afo. *AND* that the said John in

his proper Person Comes and defends the force and Injury therein &c and saith that he cannot deny the Action aforesaid of him the said Sampson nor but that he owes to the said Sampson the sum of Eight Hundred and seventy five pounds of Tobacco and no more *Whereupon* the said Sampson by his attorney aforesaid pray Judgment and those Damages acknowledged to go with his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this Part the Court is depended to him to be *judged* *Therefore* it is Considered that the said Sampson Maxwell recover against the said John Holden his Damages aforesaid to Eight Hundred and seventy five pounds of Tobacco above acknowledged and also Eight Hundred and seventy five pounds of Tobacco for his Costs and Charges by him about his Suit in this Part laid out and Expended on his afo. by the Court the afo. *judged* and the said John Holden in mercy &c
