Whereupon into Court here in his proper Person comes Thomas Gilbert of this County Barber & becomes pledge and security for the said Joseph that if it should happen that the said Joseph in the said aff<sup>o</sup> should be bound that then the said Thomas Gilbert and he should be answerable for the damages & costs which to the same they should be liable in this should be duly charged by his Lands if that he should be made and bound and for the use of the said George if it should happen that the said Joseph the damages & costs to the said George and Com<sup>r</sup> should be paid by the said Thomas Gilbert into the custody of the Sheriff by reason thereof

And the said Joseph by Thomas Black his Attorney comes and appears in the presence of the Court and says that he has to impore the Court to behold the said Charles Johnson the said Tuesday in March 1746 the same day in the name of the said Charles Johnson
