Charles County, James Mear Senior late of Charles County, Planter otherwise called James Mear Senior of Charles County was summoned to answer unto James Mear Junior & Ignatius Gamines of a^{la} that he render unto them the full and just sum of one Thousand Eighty and six pounds of good Clean well Dressed Tobacco in lb^s and four pounds Ten shillings and five pence Currency which to them he owes and unjustly detains and doeth

And whereupon the same James of Ignatius by Philip Key their Attorney say that whereas the said James Mear on the Eleventh day of August in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven Hundred and forty Six, at Charles County a^{la} within the jurisdiction of this Court by his certain Writing obligatory sealed with the seal of him the said James Mear and now here shewn to the Court the date whereof is the same day and year Oblayed himself his Heirs Exors to pay unto James Mear Junior and Ignatius Gamines the Executors of Vincent A^{la} then Deceased the sum of one Thousand Eighty and six pounds of good Clean well Dressed Tobacco in lb^s and four pounds Ten shillings and five pence Currency on demand for value received for the use of the Creditors or Leghees Nevertheless the said James Mear at the often times required hath not paid the said one Thousand Eighty and six pounds of good Clean well Dressed Tobacco and four pounds Ten shillings and five pence Currency as aforesaid to them the said James and Ignatius or any part thereof but hath to altogether refused hath and still doth Refuse to pay the same wherefore them the said James and Ignatius say they are the worse and have Damage to the Value of Two Thousand one Hundred and Seventy four pounds good Clean well Dressed Tobacco and three pounds and Ten pence Currency and therefore they bring suit forth

And the said James Mear by Henry Darnall his Attorney ^{Deft. vs. John Doe} ^{Plaintiff} defends the force and Injury when he^s and prays leave to impeach writs until the Next Court to be holden at Charles Town on the second Tuesday in March and he hath and the same day is given to the same James of Ignatius a^{la} here vs^e
