Whereupon into Court here in his proper Person Committed the said James of Charles County, Sheriff and being duly sworn and security for the said Oath that if it should happen the said Richard the said M^r Hingley should be content that then the said James yielded and granted that as much the Damages of a well Content with to the same Thomas in this part should be judged of his Lands and Chatties should be made levied up to and for the use of the said Thomas if it should happen the said Richard the Damages and Costs afo should not pay or his body into the custody of the Sheriff by Return there of then afo
