 Witness & probable Circumstances that Thomas Davis Junr late of the afo^r County is
 actually Runaway or Absconded in a secret manner from the place of his abode and has
 or about to Carry and remove away his Substance and also it appears to me this Justice
 as afo^r that the said Thomas Davis is truly and bona fide Indebted unto M^r Daniel Stephenson
 Merch^t in Whitehaven the sum of two pounds three Shillings and six pence half penny Currency
 These are therefore to will and require you forthwith on sight here of to Issue Attachment
 against the Goods Chattels & Credits of the said Thomas Davis for as well the Debt of Two
 Pounds three Shillings and six pence half penny as for the Incident Costs Charges
 in prosecuting the same Attachments and for your so doing this shall be your sufficient
