Mrs. Wardrop & Graham v. on Judgment Bond
Charles Graycroft & Judgment of Nonsum Informatus

Charles County vs. Charles Graycroft late of Charles County Plaintiff —
otherwise called Charles Graycroft of Charles County Plaintiff was summoned to answer
unto Mrs. Wardrop and Graham of a sum that he tender unto them in the sum of
Six pounds Sterling which to them the owners and Justly demands

And Whereas on the said Mrs. Wardrop and Graham by Thomas Clark their
Attorney say that whereas the said Charles on the Twenty seventh day of August in
the year one thousand seven hundred and forty six at Charles County aforesaid
by his certain Writing Obligatory with the seal of him the said Charles sealed and
herein countersigned whose Date is the day and year aforesaid acknowledged himself
to be held and firmly bound unto them the said Wardrop and Graham in the sum of
Six pounds Sterling to be paid to them the said Mrs. Wardrop and Graham when
thereunto afterword as he should be required Nevertheless at the offer requested
the said sum of Six pounds Sterling or any part thereof to them the said Mrs. Wardrop
and Graham hath not paid or in any sort contented, but the same to them the said —
Mrs. Wardrop and Graham to pay or in any sort to content hath hitherto to
together refused and still doth refuse to the damage of them the said Mrs.
Wardrop and Graham Twelve pounds Sterling and therefore sued in
brought and so forth

And the said Charles by Jeremiah Chase his Attorney comes and defendeth before
and injury wherein he doth pray a hearing of the writing Obligatory and it is made unto him
he also prays a hearing of the condition of the same Writing and it is made unto him heretofore

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Charles
Graycroft and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Mrs. Wardrop
and Graham their certain Attorney Ex ait admissit et signis the last and full sum of these
bounds Sterling money also upon the first day of October next ensuing the date hereof
with Legal Interest for the same then the above obligation to be held to remain in
full force and virtue in case he should be made to pay the payment of this said sum of these
bounds Sterling and to bind them I impower my attorney in any court or before in the
realms of Great Britain France or Ireland or within the province of Norway and other
of his Majesties dominions to appear for me at the suit of the above mentioned Wardrop
and Graham to receive a declaration on the above obligation and thereupon to bring
judgment by Habeas Corpus, Actionem, Nonsum Informatus or otherwise
Merely proceeding at the time that may happen upon this said judgment being
executed thereupon or in any of the proceeding thereunto relating

Where being read and heard the said Charles by his attorney aforesaid comes and
defends the force and injury wherein he is and the said attorney with that he is not informed
by the said Charles of any answer to be given for the said Charles to have the said Wardrop
and Graham in the sum of twelve pounds Sterling to say thereof in manner
and conclusion of the action aforesaid of the said Wardrop and Graham whereby the
same
